Butte County Director of Equalization / Planning Director Polly Odle came before the Commissioners to discuss proposed revisions for the Temporary Campground Permit Application and proposed revisions for the Temporary Campground Ordinance # 7 and Temporary Campground Ordinance # 8.

Motion by Hansen Second by Kindsfater to schedule the first reading on Monday, September 20, 2010 and the second reading on Tuesday, October 5, 2010 for the proposed revisions to the Temporary Campground Ordinance # 7 and Temporary Campground Ordinance # 8. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Motion by Hansen Second by Kindsfater to accept the changes to Ordinance 2002-1 "Building Permit Ordinance" and proceed with the second reading. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried. No one was present to make comment.

The Ordinance 2002-1 (Proposed Revisions) "Building Permit Ordinance" will become effective on September 27, 2010.

The Commissioners and Director of Equalization / Planning Director Polly Odle discussed wind towers. It was decided that each wind tower structure would be subject to a building permit at a cost of \$50.00.

NJS Engineer Neil Stodolski came before the Commissioners to discuss the Asphalt Failure on the Gray Road. Mr. Stodolski brought core samples from the Gray Road for the Commissioners to inspect. Bituminous Paving, Inc. was the contractor for the project. The Commissioners directed NJS Engineer Neil Stodolski and Highway Superintendent Don Adams to proceed with finding a solution to fix the Asphalt Failure on the Gray Road.

No one was present for the scheduled Public Hearing for the Highway Gravel Transfer.

The Commissioners recessed for lunch at 12:00 p.m. with the public invited.

The Commissioners reconvened at 1:39 p.m. with all Commissioners present.

Sheriff Lamphere came before the Commissioners to update them on happenings within his department. Sheriff Lamphere reported that State's Attorney Tim Vander Heide and he would be meeting with Belle Fourche City Acting Mayor Gary Hendrickson later in the afternoon to discuss the 2011 Dispatch Budget.

Mr. Robert Albright came before the Commissioners to discuss a public safety concern in the City of Belle Fourche. Sheriff Lamphere informed Mr. Albright that he would put a letter together addressed to the Belle Fourche City Council stating his concerns.

State's Attorney Tim Vander Heide and Deputy State's Attorney Heather Plunkett came before the Commissioners to discuss their agenda items.

State's Attorney Tim Vander Heide presented the Commissioners with a draft proposing changes to the residency requirements in the Butte County Informational Booklet.

No action was taken on the matter pertaining to the gravel at the Buchholz Pit. State's Attorney Tim Vander Heide and Highway Superintendent Don Adams are drafting a letter addressed to Fisher Sand & Gravel expressing Butte County's concern regarding the gravel.

Motion by Hansen Second by Smeenk to authorize Chairman Kling to sign the InVision Migration System Agreement between Tyler Technologies, Inc. and Butte County. This is for total hardware and system software and installation fees for the amount of \$79,585.00. This upgrade is for Financial Applications, Personnel Management, Cash Collections, SD Voter Registrations & Absentee Voters, Real Estate Tax Records and SD Tax Management System. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Motion by Hansen Second by Smeenk to transfer \$98,098.00 from the Highway Gravel Reserve Fund 201 to Highway Cash Fund 201 and to supplement the Highway Budget for the same amount. This is to cover expenses incurred for gravel crushing and royalty costs. Vote Unanimous. Motion Carried.

The Application For Occupancy On The Right Of Way Of County Highways for Woelber Excavation, Inc. to Trench a Water Line on the North Side of West Wood Road will be held until Highway Superintendent Don Adams has received clarification from Mr. Woelber regarding the project.
