House Bill 1099 would have allowed taxing districts by the vote of a 2/3rds majority of the governing board to revise their base amount of revenue payable from taxes on real property for taxes payable in 2015 or 2016. If a taxing district were to revise their base amount, it would terminate any existing opt out. This was pushed as an option for local governments to readjust from the current property tax cap. This bill died on the House floor on the close vote of 32-36.

Senate Bill 1 as introduced would have increased highway revenue through user fees for local governments by about \$15.3 million a year beginning on May 1, 2010 and then would increase to about \$30 million a year beginning on 2012. The initial proposal included increases in registration fees, a 10 cent gas tax increase, and changing the old age exemption on vehicles from 5 to 10 years. The bill was tabled at the request of the sponsors due to lack of support on the Senate floor.
