The City also keeps the books etc pays the bills and the hospital does the billing for them as it was difficult to find a manager to do all of this. Kimball Ambulance also started a taxing entity in about 2000 I believe so we have to ambulance services in Brule County that are funded with tax dollars.

Custer	Custer County does not own/operate an ambulance Service. We have an ambulance district that levies taxes for revenue.

Day	Day County contracts with Christensen Ambulance Service of Webster, SD. The county contributed \$49,650 to his business to help offset some the cases that are uncollectible or claims that Medicaid, etc does not pay the whole fee. It seems to work good for our county. Commission receives a monthly Profit & Loss Statement from Christensen Ambulance.

Dewey	Dewey County owns the ambulances in that we hold the titles and pay the insurance out of the \$7,443 given to the Ambulance to operate. We do not collect fees or pay EMT's - we do have EMT's on WC as volunteers. We are now down to 1 ambulance service due to a lack of volunteers.

Douglas County owns the ambulances and all expense for our county ambulance service. We run two ambulance, one out of Armour and one out of Corsica. Our EMT's are volunteer, but we pay their wages - \$25.00 for the first hour of a call and \$20.00 per hour for the remaining time spent on a call. For 2010 and 2011 we budgeted \$36,700, but half way through the 2010 year they have already spent \$25,334.04. They have had alot of repair work done this year. We also are putting \$20,000 away for five years to purchase a new ambulance. Our office feels that the hospital should take over the ambulance since they collect and keep all payments for the ambulance services. We looked back and 10 year's ago the hospital use to reimburse the county from what they collected.
No County Ambulance service in Edmund. The County supports: \$3,600 to Ipswich Ambulance, \$3,600 to Bowdle Ambulance and \$1,000 to Roscoe Rescue (all per year).
Our Ambulances are all districts, so no money towards their operations.
Grant County does not own/operate the ambulance service. We contract with the service at \$24,500 per yer.
We own and operate our two ambulances. Proposed budget for 2011 is \$31,950
Jerauld County owns the ambulance but it is operated through the hospital. The commissioners approve the bills each month and the ambulance has its own checking account. The budget for 2011 is \$25,000.00.
Lawrence County contracts for ambulance services in the County at a cost of \$10,450 a year.
We do own and operate the Marshall County Ambulance. The budget for 2011 is around 110,000. This budget doesn't usually cover replacing an ambulance.
McCook County does not operate an ambulance service. We do provide appropriations as follows: Bridgewater Ambulance Service \$28,002; McCook Emergency Medical Service \$127,330. There will be no change for 2011 because of the 0% CPI.
Miner County operates the ambulance service. We employ 2 full time on call EMTs (one is on at all time) and then utilize our volunteers
to run as a 2 nd person on all calls. This has been in place for about 2 years and is working well. Our annual budget for this year is \$144,141.

Don't know how that will come out.
